

More Painting of St. Mark's Church (July 2014)

Stark Painting completed all of the painting of the south facing wall of the building exterior and also all of the high white facia trim and steeple/bell tower base.

Summary of St. Mark's Finances—8/24/2014 (Last--6/16/2014)

Net Operating Year to Date-- \$32.92 (Last--\$-1,458.26)

July, August, and September revenues have exceeded expenses to put us in good shape to complete the year with a small surplus.

Total Operating Expenses-- \$15,495.53 (Last--\$13,066.77)

Highlights—All bills received are paid current. Outreach to Date--\$3,550 Diocesan Assessment Required/Paid--\$1,665

Total Operating Revenues-- \$15,528.45 (Last--\$11,608.51)

Pledges income is slightly behind budget, which was estimated very conservatively, allowing for contingencies. Other revenues are as expected.

Non-Operating Revenues--\$1,805.66 Non-Operating Expenses--\$11,858.93 Net Non-Operating Year to Date--\$-10,946.73 (Last--\$-4,976.50)
