

#### **Recent News**

#### Church Annual Meeting (2/16/2014), 11:30AM after Worship, at St. Mark's

This meeting was held following the Sunday morning Holy Communion service, in the Parish Hall. A great lunch of pancakes, and egg casserole, sausages, and fruit was served. (Our new griddle was used for this—a trial for its full use on Pancake Day.) Review of the last year at St. Mark's, the 2014 approved budget, the status of our funds (increased greatly in one year), discussion about our outreach support and other plans. Elections for the Bishop's Committee (adding Lee and Joyce Avery and Natalea Brumfield) and Delegates for Convention (Mary Stubb, Mary Linth and Martha Krug) were voted in. And, brief discussion about possible other kitchen changes were mentioned--checks into electrical and plumbing mods needed for a tankless electric water heater and also what it will take for a small commercial dishwasher to be installed.

#### Summary of St. Mark's Finances—2/25/2014 (end of January)

#### **Net Operating Year to Date-- \$-841.27** (Last--\$-13.60)

With the annual property/liability insurance payment, and expected routine expenses, cash flow is a challenge right now.

#### **Total Operating Expenses-- \$3,815.79** (Last--\$1,278.12)

Highlights—All routine bills are paid current. Outstanding bills for the heat pump repair (over \$700), and reimbursements to the Campbells for materials for the new parish hall baseboards and painting (over \$300) need to be covered with either regular income soon, or with a withdrawal from the DIF. Outreach to Date--\$42 Diocesan Assessment Required/Paid--\$417

#### **Total Operating Revenues-- \$2,974.52** (Last--\$1,264.52)

Pledges are slightly behind at this point, but it is too early to be a trend yet.

Non-Operating Revenues--\$20.00 Non-Operating Expenses--\$2,596.02 Net Non-Operating Year to Date--\$2,576.02 (Last--\$20.00)

Net All Operating and Non-Operating Year to Date-- \$-3,417.29 (Last -- \$-13.60)

#### Funds Summary—Total is \$31,540.60 (last--\$34,957,89)

- General/Designated Checking Account—\$107.41 (last--\$3,544.72)
- General/Designated Savings Account--\$518.62 (last--\$518.60)
  - Operating Fund (General)--\$626.03 (last--\$4,063.32)
- Clergy Discretionary Fund/Checking Account--\$586.24 (last--\$566.24)
- Diocesan Investment Fund--\$30,328.33 (last--30,328.33) (No update for end of January yet.)
